Members agreed the things the Partnership will do. These will be looked at again in March. The Partnership will have its own action plan. Justin will tell the Board in March how much money is being spent on learning disability services.

People are living longer. This is very good news but older people sometimes need a lot of care. The money we have for services must be used in the right ways and we need to help people look after themselves and get help from family and friends.

4.



Justin has talked to members of the Learning Disability Partnership and other groups about what Adult Care should be doing. There is now a plan in place, which the Partnership will help make happen. Mick is to put this in easy read.

We need to help people into paid jobs. Justin is to find a way of paying people for the work they do with Adult Care. Some people who do voluntary work or go to day services could be helped to find paid jobs. We need to help young people plan ahead to find a job. Mick is to set up a group to look at this.



We need to make sure family carers get the right support. We will ask carers for their ideas and ask Public Health about the health needs of carers. The Partnership will also help Adult Care find out what housing people with learning disabilities need.



It is important to help more people think about having a Direct Payment. The right help needs to be in place, along with the sorts of services people want to buy. Adult Care would like more people to use Shared Lives services.

There is a new group for young people called Lincolnshire Young Voices. We will make sure this group feels welcome in the Partnership. The right help needs to be in place for young people with learning disabilities as they become young adults.

South West Lincolnshire CCG is making sure more people get a yearly health check, and helping GP's to better understand peoples' needs. It will make sure the Partnership knows how Transforming Care is working.

8.



Service providers are important in making sure people have their voices heard. They will not come to Board meetings, but we will work with them at different times to make the parts of plan happen.

9.



We need to let people know what the Partnership is doing. Mick will bring some ideas for this to the next meeting. Rob will make sure the Learning Disability and Autism partnerships know what each are doing and work together.

A photograph was taken of the Board. It will meet four times a year. Members were asked to think about how we will show at the end of the year that the Partnership has been a success.
